"Building a new home or doing a remodel gives clients an opportunity to see things in a different way, get out of an old rut and broaden their horizons. I am thrilled when clients comment, 'I am so glad you convinced me to do that; I never could have imagined it.' Once I've identified the comfort zone of a client, I love to push the envelope and ask them to consider adding something they never thought they would include in their repertoire." Such a forward-thinking approach has garnered Brooks an unprecedented reputation and a wide appeal. "My work is not easily recognizable, unless you're familiar with a number of projects I've done over the years. Then you may start to feel, rather than see, the common thread that runs through them all—comfort and warmth." For example, Brooks asserts that people often comment that they always thought of contemporary as being "cold and uninviting"—that is, until they see her portfolio. "Regardless of the architectural and/or design style we're working in, I see it as my duty to creatively interpret their personal style. Just because a client loves clean lines doesn't mean they can't move into a Tuscan-styled home and make it feel spacious and modern. Conversely, even if a client doesn't think they will be comfortable in a minimalist architectural environment doesn't mean I can't help them warm it up. Above all else, a house should always feel like home."
